



## Love Letters

Most of us can remember our days in elementary and middle school where kids would pass notes in class. If that special girl or boy started a note in your direction your heart began to race, in part out of fear that the teacher would intercept it and read it out loud to the rest of the class, and in part because of the anticipation of what it might say. As a young Air Force officer, I was stationed in England. I tried to maintain a long-distance relationship with a young lady in California. With phone calls costing \$2 a minute we relied on letters to stay connected. When those letters arrived, I would read every word over and over again. It helped me feel close to its author. That relationship and those letters have long disappeared, but I still have a “treasure box” of letters and cards from parents, grandparents that hold a dear place in my heart.

That is how I look at God’s Word – it is His love letter to me. When I first became a follower of Christ at the age of 23, I was encouraged to start a 15-minute quiet each day where I would read Scripture and pray. I couldn’t imagine doing that every day, but I gave it a try. Forty-five years later it is still a part of my spiritual disciplines. Thirty-five years ago, my pastor encouraged me to commit to reading the entire Bible in a year. Again, I couldn’t imagine doing that, but that too has been a part of my spiritual discipline for 35 years. Fifteen minutes has given way to hours. Like love letters earlier in my life, God continues to reveal Himself to me every time I come to His love letter. I read it over and over because I’m in love with the God who gives it. I don’t believe we can truly know God apart from His word.

Thirty years ago this month, our family headed to Texas where I would attend seminary. I remember my professor in my first New Testament class saying that his greatest fear is that “we would take that which is holy and treat it as that which is common.” We then began to dissect the New Testament looking at arguments for and against authorship, authenticity, dating, etc. It’s the information you usually find in the introduction of a good commentary. I found myself becoming depressed as my love letter became something else. Although

that training was useful, I'm glad I was able to quickly return to reading Scripture as much with my heart as my head.

The Bible is an incredible book. It was written over a period of 1500 years, using 40 different authors. It forms the foundation for Judaism, Islam, and Christianity. The King James version contains 788,258 words, 31,102 verses, 1,189 chapters, and 66 books. In its entirety it has been translated into 532 languages, with part of it being translated into 2,883 languages. It is by far the best-selling book of all time. And yet, the Bible is under attack today, even within the church. Christians want to decide which parts of the Bible are still reliable and trustworthy, choosing to hold to those parts that are comfortable and rejecting parts that contradict our culture. Try that with a love letter.

This past week I was reading Paul's epistle to the Romans. I was struck by how amazing it was that any one human being could pull together so many incredible truths into one letter. I thought about the fact that he was a well-trained theologian, but then I remembered that other incredible writings in the Bible were penned by uneducated shepherds and fishermen. I then reflected on the miracle of God's intervention with ordinary men to make Himself known to us through His revelation. That revelation was made most clear in His incarnation in Christ. Even what we know about Jesus is through the careful documentation in God's Word.

Paul wrote Timothy that "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness" (2 Tim 3:16, NIV). God was active in its writing from beginning to end. David, in Psalm 19:7-8 wrote "the law of the Lord is perfect, reviving the soul. The statutes of the Lord are trustworthy, making wise the simple. The precepts of the Lord are right, giving joy to the heart. (NIV) The Articles of Faith in the Church of the Nazarene says that Scripture was "given by divine inspiration, inerrantly revealing the will of God concerning all things necessary to our salvation . . ." I believe that Scripture is inerrant period. God would not let anything imperfect into His love letter.

So, what about you? Isn't it time to pull out the greatest love letter of all time? Grab a cup of coffee, find a comfortable chair, and pour over every word like it was from the greatest love of your life – because it is! I was thinking about that treasure box. The only thing that would make reading those old cards and letters better, is if I could have my mom, dad, son, and grandparents there to read them with me. What is so awesome is we get to do that with the author of God's Word. Paul wrote, "No eye has seen, no ear has heard, no mind has conceived what God has prepared for those who love him" - but God has revealed it to us by his Spirit.

The Spirit searches all things, even the deep things of God. For who among men knows the thoughts of a man except the man's spirit within him? In the same way no one knows the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God. We have not received the spirit of the world but the Spirit who is from God, that we may understand what God has freely given us. This is what we speak, not in words taught us by human wisdom but in words taught by the Spirit, expressing spiritual truths in spiritual words. (1 Cor 2:9-13, NIV)

God is ready and waiting for us to join him for a cup of coffee and conversation. Don't stand Him up.
